To all of our families who have celebrated this week, we hope it has been a special and enjoyable one.

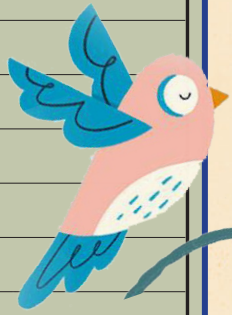
